Wood Centre for Innovation

Opened in 2019, the Wood Centre for Innovation is located in Oxford's world-leading Health and Life Sciences District in Headington.

Set in 15 acres of woodland, the Centre is close to the University of Oxford's Old Road Campus, the NHS research and teaching hospitals and Oxford Brookes University.

The Centre offers you virtual offices, co-working space in Barclays Eagle Labs (see page 18), office space, technical workshops and R&D laboratories as well as a café and meeting and conference facilities for up to 100 people.







Oxford Centre for Innovation

The Oxford Centre for Innovation is right in the heart of Oxford, next to the Castle, and close to the train and bus station, shops, theatres, museums, galleries, restaurants and bars.

It is also a short walk from the Centre to many of the University of Oxford's science facilities, the Saïd Business School and social entrepreneurship centres.

The Centre offers you virtual offices, co-working space in Barclays Eagle Labs (see page 18), office space, and technical workspace as well as meeting rooms.





That's why the Trust's two innovation centres are more than just office and lab spaces; we help companies thrive.

Over the last 36 years, the Trust has helped hundreds of science and tech companies to flourish including Mirada Medical, Perspectum Diagnostics, Navenio, Natural Motion and, more recently, Ultromics.



With you from the start

We work closely with Barclays Eagle Labs and Oxford Innovation to create a growth pathway for start-up science and tech businesses.

Based in both our centres, Barclays Eagle Labs offers fledgling companies an incubator environment with co-working space and business support.

Eagle Labs, Oxford is focused on science and tech start-ups aimed at supporting spinout scientists, university graduates and entrepreneurs.

There is co-working space for 40 entrepreneurs at the Wood Centre for Innovation and 12 people at the Oxford Centre for Innovation.

An Ecosystem Manager and a dedicated Lab Manager provide technical expertise, mentoring and connections to maximise the growth of early-stage start-ups.

Also, you will have access to the wider Eagle Lab support proposition and Barclays' local business banking teams with their specialist high-growth managers to provide you with banking support.

Companies that 'graduate' from the Eagle Labs can easily move on to space in our centres, whether it's office space or R&D labs, or a combination of both, and benefit from continued business support from Oxford Innovation.
